

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q How many wind farms and wind turbines are located in Benton County?

A While future development is ongoing, there are currently three wind farms in Benton County. They are the Benton County Wind Farm, the Fowler Ridge Wind Farm and the Hoosier Wind Farm. There are over 400 total wind turbines in Benton County and still counting.

Q How big is a wind turbine?

A The size of a turbine depends on its manufacturer. The GE 1.5 megawatt turbines stand on a 240 feet tall column with 110 foot long blades. The total height of the GE 1.5 megawatt turbine, including the generator, is 372 feet. That's 12 feet longer than a football field!

Q How much electricity does one turbine generate?

A The amount of electricity generated by a wind turbine varies depending on the type of turbine. A 2.5 megawatt Clipper turbine can provide power for 700 homes.

Q Where does the electricity that is generated by the turbines go to?

A Electricity generated by the turbines is delivered to many different areas of the United States. Some of the electricity has been purchased by Duke Energy and has been sold to the Chicago market.


Tour Includes:


OUR HISTORY
